MALAGUEÑA



Cuban-born composer Ernesto Lecuona (1896-1963) wrote and performed music during his entire creative career that reflected the passion and exhilarating spirit of his native country. Animated dance rhythms, bold harmonies, and dramatic folk elements are vital parts of all his compositions.

The piano suite Andalucia (referred to also as Suite Española) is by far his most performed and remembered work, especially the last of its six movements, Malagueña. The suite celebrates the Andalucia area of the most Southern part of Spain and, more notably, the vibrant culture of those who live there.



SHADOW DEFENDERS



Katie O'Hara LaBrie is a conductor, composer, cellist, and clinician from Northern Virginia. An educator at heart, LaBrie spent the first 15 years of her career teaching orchestra in Fairfax County, Virginia. In addition to her love of teaching, she is a published composer and arranger and is the editor for the Orchestra Division of Randall Standridge Music Publications. Her composition "Drive" was commissioned in 2024 by the Contemporary Youth Orchestra in celebration of our 30th Anniversary and will be published by Alfred Music in the spring of 2026.

From the first note of Shadow Defenders, a sense of suspense, along with an intense desire to protect and avenge leaves you wondering what's looming around the corner. In Shadow Defenders, you will find a hero seeking to balance the dark mysteries of the past, and the light that lays ahead.

LaBrie consulted teachers and students when naming this piece and "discovered that everyone perceived a different story. Some heard medieval castles and knights, others heard vikings, spies, pirates, or even electricity.....even when we are in the depths of battle, such as a personal struggle or a trail we must overcome, there can always be an underlying sense of hope that we will conquer and make it through to the other side."

DANZA FINAL



Composer Alberto Ginastera, an influential 20th-century Argentine composer, is known for incorporating folk elements into classical music. Danza Final (Malambo) is the final movement of his ballet Estancia and showcases the musical skill required to perform the cross rhythms and driving tempo, as well as, celebrating Argentine culture.

An estancia is a large Argentinian cattle ranch. In his ballet, Alberto Ginastera depicts the hustle and bustle of a busy day on an estancia. The story is centered around a love triangle between a city boy who falls in love with a beautiful ranch girl. She dismisses him as unworthy in comparison to the other more masculine gauchos (horsemen) who work on her father's estancia. The city boy follows her to the ranch, determined to prove himself.

Danza Final (Malambo) reflects the flamboyant malambo dance of the Argentine gauchos as they demonstrate their agility and machismo in a "dance fight" competing with the city boy where only one man will be left standing.



A CHEGADA DOS CANDANGOS



LENDA

FEATURING MICHELLE SAAB, FRENCH HORN MILES HOEHLER, PIANO

Antônio Carlos Jobim (1927 – 1994) was a Brazilian composer, pianist, guitarist, songwriter, arranger, and singer. Jobim merged samba with cool jazz in the 1960s to create bossa nova and is regarded as one of the most celebrated songwriters of the 20th century. Many of his songs are jazz standards (Girl from Ipanema) and he collaborated with a long list of legends in the music industry, including Frank Sinatra, Stan Getz, Herbie Hancock, and Chick Corea.

A Chegada dos Candangos (The Workers Arrive) was composed to inaugurate the 1960 founding of Brazil's modern capital, Brasília. Jobim composed A Chegada dos Candangos while living in a Brasília under construction and is part of a larger symphonic poem (Brasília: Sinfonia da Alvorada) celebrating the birth of the capital. A Chegada dos Candangos depicts the march of the construction workers onto their job sites and utilizes the baiao rhythm, popular in the Northeast of Brazil where many of the candangos (construction workers) came from.

A Chegada dos Candangos decays into Lenda (legend) and is an homage to Jobim's father, Jorge Jobim. Lenda was composed earlier than A Chegada dos Candangos but it is notable in that one can hear references to the ending of Lenda in A Chegada dos Candangos.



DANZON NO. 7

FEATURING ANDREW SAAB, TRUMPET GRAHAM BUBB, TROMBONE



Arturo Márquez is a living Mexican composer of orchestral music who incorporates the musical forms and styles of Mexico into his compositions. He began composing at the age of 16 and attended the Conservatorio Nacional where he studied piano and music theory. Márquez was influenced by his studies with

Morton Subotnick at the California Institute of the Arts marked a pivotal moment, influencing his work to become more collaborative, encompassing dance, theatre, and film.

While perhaps less avant-garde, this interest in mixed media and the inclusion of other artforms in his own work came together with his interest in using Mexican and other Latin folk influences in his works in his best-known series of works- the Danzónes.

While a danzón is a formal ballroom dance similar to the tango and derived from the habanera of Cuba, Marquez drew inspiration from the dance hall scene in Veracruz, Mexico. According to Marquez, "Danzón No. 7 is a tribute to the world that nurtured it. It tries to get as close as possible to the dance, to its nostalgic melodies and its monotonous rhythms, and is a personal way of expressing my admiration and feelings towards real Mexican popular music."



SINFONIA INDIA

FEATURING ANDREW SAAB, TRUMPET LAINEY MILLER, CLARINET ARISA BOONPONGMANEE, FLUTE



Carlos Chávez was at the forefront of creating and shaping modern Mexico's musical institutions: holding several government posts as an arts administrator, founding and directing two of Mexico's symphonies, director of Mexico's national conservatory.

Sinfonía India is Carlos Chávez's Symphony No.

2. While only a single movement, its sections

follow the traditional pattern for a three-movement symphony.

Sinfonía India is a product of a time in which Chávez's aesthetics were focused on music of the indigenous peoples of North America and modern folk music of Mexico. Reflective of these influences, the three main themes reflect melodies of the Huicholes of Nayarit, the Yaqui of Sonora, and the Series of Tiburón Island in Baja California. Sinfonía India also features a relentless rhythmic drive utilizing extreme tempo changes to signify the transition between "movements". Chávez had this to say about his work

"The idea of repetition and variation can be replaced by the notion of constant rebirth, of true derivation: a stream that never comes back to its source; a stream in eternal development, like a spiral ..."





EL CONDOR PASA

FEATURING SKYLER GRANOFF - PAN FLUTE



"El Condor Pasa" (The Condor Passes) is one of the best-known Peruvian melodies, its ancient Inca origins captured in this dramatic arrangement. While the melody was popularized by Simon and Garfunkel, it is

significantly older, with numerous versions found throughout the high Andes of Peru—a region the arranger, Dr. Buchanan, has explored over many decades.

The piece vividly evokes the majestic image of the condor's flight as it circles above the snow-capped Andean mountains and valleys. This flight symbolizes the vast expanse of the former Inca Empire. The arrangement heightens the emotional intensity of the traditional "lamento," beginning with a gradual crescendo that builds to a dramatic peak before decrescendoing toward the end. This effect is achieved through a lush scoring that includes tribal drums, woodwinds, brass, and strings.
